

# **REL 2510: Chinese Religion**

## **Course Description:**

This course provides an introduction to Chinese religion and explores the diversity and unity of Chinese traditions. Focus will be on aspects of the cultural background, art, literature, philosophy, and institutional development of each tradition. Topics covered include ancient mythology, cosmology, shamanism; Confucianism and the traditional state cult, Taoist mysticism, immortality; Buddhism and Chinese religious transformation.

### **Course Goals:**

A student who satisfactorily completes this course should:

- 1. Acquire solid information of the religious traditions and Chinese religions.
- 2. Read the primary texts in English translation.
- 3. Describe, analyze, and define the major characteristics of Chinese religions.
- 4. Relate the ideas of the course to each other in a meaningful way.

Required readings will be handed out in class.

#### Papers:

There will be three paper assignments. Each paper should be between 1370 and 1500 words long. The papers together will count for 45% of your grade for the course. Each paper will count equally to 15%.

Topics will be made available two weeks before papers are due. All papers must be double spaced, in 12-point Times New Roman font, with 1" margins all around.

### **Exams:**

This course will have an in-class closed-book mid-term exam and an in-class closed-book non-cumulative final exam. Each exam will cover course materials taught until the day before the exam. Exam questions include multiple choices, short-answer and essay questions, covering material from the lecture and all assigned course materials.

## **Attendance:**

Attendance is mandatory. More than three unexcused absences will result in an automatic reduction in your participation grade, for instance from A- to B+. Your active participation in the class is expected and constitutes part of your grade.
