Course Description:

This is the second course of Introductory Japanese. This course will further introduce students to the fundamentals of modern Japanese, aiming to help students foster the four language skills including speaking, listening, reading and writing, as well as Japanese culture awareness. This course, closely following the textbook (covering chapters 7 to 12) and focused on the frequently-used communicative situations, will familiarize students with the Japanese sound and language structure by mastering its three writing systems: hiragana, katakana, and kanji.

Learning Objectives:

Upon completion of the course, you will be able to:

- recognize and write Hiragana, Katakana and 127 essential Kanji including those from JPN 101.
- comprehend and practice spoken language based on chapter topics and vocabulary;
- read and comprehend written Japanese passages or conversations based on chapter topic and vocabulary;
- introduce and express yourself regarding various common situations;
- develop basic knowledge of Japanese culture;
- prepare for further level Japanese language learning.
